SABER  
combines nine  
months of  
therapy and  
life-changing  
skills with the  
guarantee of  
free housing,  
as long as the  
person stays  
drug and  
alcohol-free.  
This  
expectation  
helps the  
program  
achieve a 55%  
success rate  
after nine  
months,  
compared  
with a  
national  
average of  
20% for other  
substance  
programs. In

addition, 85% complete SABER's three-month intensive treatment. And there's another important difference: SABER costs \$500 per person per month, compared with an average of \$2,300 per month for typical residential care.
